





The Estate Oak Swan Stove F Series 160

Each convention a “theme” stove is selected. This year our theme stove is the Estate Oak F Series 160. This stove was manufactured by Kahn Brothers and the “swan stove” as it was known became one of their most notable products between 1890-1912. The Antique Stove Association is honored to have the great grandson of the artisan of the fantastic swan ornamentation on the stove as a member! Our member Jon Thiem is the great grandson of Rudolph Thiem (1857-1928), who in his time became a well-known sculptor in SW Ohio. The following is an excerpt from the work that Jon has done in documenting his ancestor’s life and work. I invite you all to explore his website that has a wealth of information on this great artist as well. The artwork on so many of these stoves is what draws many of our membership to the love and enjoyment of these stoves. Please visit rudolphthiem.weebly.com.

The Kahn Brothers Estate Oak parlor stove is the only known example of swan art that Rudolph Thiem created with a larger public in mind. For this project, he designed two nickel-plated swan ornaments made of cast metal. They are attached to opposite sides of the stove’s cylindrical fire box.

The oak-carved table swans and the nickeled stove swans are close relatives, showing aesthetic and anatomical similarities. Like the table swans, those on the stove have unnaturally large eyes, vertical postures, un-swan-like bills, and heads resting on their breasts.

The differences, of course, are due to the types of furniture they adorn. The materials of the ornaments—wood versus metal—also change the swans’ position and function in the overall design of their respective furnishings. The table swans are structural supports—the stove swans are not. The lyre effect of the swan table legs is not the same as the framing effect of the stove swans. As for the figures themselves, the table swans are rather spare, while the stove swans are enveloped in fancy scrollwork.

Like lions and storks and other creatures found in decorative formats, swans seldom appear entirely “true to life.” The Estate Oak swan has no agency, unlike the natural swan which was renowned for its mobility on water and in the air. Rudolph de-

cided not to give it any semblance of motion and his swan does not inhabit a landscape.

The Estate Oak swans, like the table leg ones, are in some measure hybrid creatures combining goose and duck features. A recent sales description for an Estate Oak swan stove could not decide if the cast ornaments were geese or swans. (See the close-up view of an Estate Oak swan, below.)

To the casual observer the Estate Oak swans might be taken for geese or ducks. They sport duck-like bills and crests. Despite these features, the figures are clearly mute swans. Rudolph Thiem puts in a knob between forehead and bill and also an articulation between eye and bill called the lores. Both are identifiers of the mute swan.




Illustration detail of an

Like other ornamental designers, Rudolph Thiem reworks the lineaments of a life form to make it fit into a distinctive “artistic world” or design. He simplifies. He exaggerates. With a swipe of his modeling blade he deletes body parts. Such departures from realism often arise from the constraints imposed by an artistic genre. They are also affected by a project’s audience, scale, location, and methods of reproduction.

The “swan stove” became one of the Kahn Brothers’ most notable products between 1890 and 1912. The earliest version is likely the Estate Oak F Series parlor stove. Lazard Kahn most likely had Thiem create the swan figures to capture the attention of swan-crazy consumers of the late 19th century. As late as 1912, a company catalog showcased their Estate Oak G and K series, both of which, at that point in time, incorporated the swan figures and retained the ornamental program of the old F Series. The Estate Oak F Series with swans were upscale wood-burning parlor-stoves manufactured in the last decade of the nineteenth century. Nickel-plated “trimmings” and figures made the Estate Oak swan stoves more expensive. The Kahn brothers also offered plainer and cheaper Estate Oak F Series models lacking the swan ornaments.

The composition of the swans, their metallic brilliance and exotic aura, make these Estate Oak ornaments remarkable. In the 1912 catalog, the Kahn Brothers talked up the appearance of this line of stoves:

Estate Oak Stoves are admired everywhere for the beautiful symmetry of their lines, the artistic carving, their handsome, durable finish, and the lavish use of nickel in their trimmings.

Nineteenth-century wood-burning stoves were workaday appliances, dirty, hard to maintain, prone to malfunction. But they were not exclusively appliances. Families treated them as furnishings. The exterior of a quality stove enhanced the decor of a parlor, and it often held a place of pride there. People gathered round this modern version of the ancient “hearth.” The parlor stove not only heated the room; it stood for the warmth and intimacy of family life.

Women looked for a parlor stove that was not only user-friendly and efficient, but also beautiful and imposing. Quality of decoration was a major selling point for the Kahn Brothers and other stove companies.

~~The Estate Oak Swans

The Estate Oak swans are not full-figure and yet neither are they spare and schematic like the table swans. Richness of detail prevails. The nickel figures stand out against the black finish of the stove’s cast iron. They project an astonishing brilliance, not unlike swans in nature.

At some angles, the swan figures look like supports for the upper part of the stove. Closer examination shows, however, they have no load-bearing function. The swans look solid when seen from the front. That they were made for show becomes clear when you step behind the stove. The swan body is hollowed out and unfinished, like a theatrical prop.

These swan “side wings” serve as a kind of framing device. They are uprights, which, at first glance, seem to join two horizontal elements: the shiny nickeled “skirt” just below the domed stove top and the nickeled “skirt” of the footrest just above the stove’s base. In fact, the verticals or horizontals do not touch at all. Still, they do form a frame of sorts, one that calls attention to the front of the stove, especially its two main doors and the name plate “Estate Oak.”

~~Scrollwork

The strong visual impression the swans make owes much to the arrangement and modeling of the scrollwork emanating from them.

At the swan’s lower neck, for instance, the series of four “comma” scrolls increase in size as they descend the vertical. Filling the gaps between the scrolls are radial grooves. The whorls and grooves represent stylized wings—emblems for the arched wings of a mute swan on water. These motifs both complement and run counter to the robust curve of the swan’s breast—a pattern of opposing vectors, here, that generates visual excitement.

Immediately below this group is a series of three spirals that get progressively smaller as they descend the vertical axis. These are a stylized version of tail feathers. Rudolph exercises “ornamental license” here: he gives his swan the curling tail feathers of a mallard. Not only that, he endows the swan with a curling crest or head plume, more characteristic of a heron or duck than a swan.

The tail-feather spirals unlike the comma whorls above, are pierced rather than solid. You can see through them. The designer has joined these three pierced volutes with a curving leaf motif that flows around and into each of them. Another feature of note is that each spiral reverses the spiral direction of the one above it—a variation that enhances the decorative effect.

Other enrichments, like the rippling lines of plumage on the swan's neck, appear in shallow relief. Gracing the swan's breast is a sort of escutcheon supported by a rounded accent figure. This motif has the semblance of breast armor. It is akin to the oval boss, fleur-de-lis, and leaf ensemble that adorn the chests of the table-leg swans

Rudolph uses compression, segmentation, and subtle articulations to bring out these several avian motifs. The arrangement is cohesive and intricate—not multiple and dispersed as in the rococo adornments on several of Rudolph's cookstove designs.

Although the swans are immobile and fixed within a formal scheme, the patterned scrolling and bold curves project a concentrated energy that makes up for this. The large, slightly bulging eyes of the swans catch ambient light and make them come alive. Latent strength courses through the strong coils and volutes of wing and tail. Bent necks and curving bills contain a spring-like force. An Estate Oak swan reminds one of an Eastern dragon.

Rudolph Thiem emigrated to America from Berlin in 1881, after receiving his advanced training at the Berlin Institute of Applied Art and Design. He worked directly with Lazard Kahn and was employed by him shortly after the Kahn brothers moved their business and foundry to Hamilton, OH.

Jon inherited Rudolph's carving tools and several of his carved pieces. Since Jon was young Rudolph Thiem has always been a kind of presence in his life. His work stimulated Jon's interest in art and its larger historical significance.


